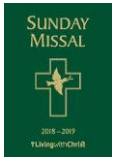

KNOWING YOUR FAITH – How serious is the Seal of Confession binding every priest-confessor?

The seal of confession is the sacred obligation seriously imposed on all priest-confessors never, under any circumstances whatsoever, to reveal anything made known to them in any confession. There is no known instance of any priest ever violating the sacredly tight-bound seal of confession by revealing anything whatsoever heard in a confession, not even by any priest who may have abandoned the practice of his priesthood whatever may have been his souring experience or disillusionment. On the other hand, there are numerous cases on record in which a priest went to his death rather than reveal what had been told to him in any confession. The seal of confession is absolute and completely binding on each and every priest by solemn vow to God almighty. That seal applies under each and every circumstance, even should that confession be invalid or absolution be denied. The confessor is seriously forbidden never to say to anyone anything whatsoever, including even to the penitent outside of confession. No one, not even a Pope, can under any pretext, however important, ever attempt to dispense any priest from the complete secrecy of the Seal of Confession. Nor may the confessor treat the penitent any differently, even after he or she dies, because of what he may have learned from any penitent in Confession. Clearly, God watches in a special way over this Seal of Confession and its scrupulous observance, so that the faithful can go to Confession certain that nothing will ever be revealed about their sins from their confession.
