FAITH CORNER



KNOWING YOUR FAITH – What is a partial and a plenary Indulgence? An indulgence is the remission of some or all of the temporal punishment due to sins, which debt may yet remain after the sins are forgiven. It is that punishment which must be satisfied either on earth or in purgatory.

This applies because of our transgression even after that sin has been forgiven by the absolution of a priest. As all Catholics know, the penance given by the priest in confession is really rather slight, actually a few simple prayers leaving the penitent free to do anything more on his or her own.

A *plenary* indulgence is a release from all punishment due to absolved sin, whereas a partial indulgence is a release from some of such.
