FAITH CORNER – THE LIVES OF THE SAINTS

Saint Philip was born to a respected couple that had been childless for many years. At the age of thirteen, he was sent to Paris to study medicine, and by the age of nineteen, had earned degrees in both medicine and philosophy. After years of practicing medicine in Florence, he began to study the Bible, as well as the lives of the saints. It was then that he began to feel a religious calling. He left

his career as a physician to join a group of seven Servites, a new religious Order, who had chosen to live in great austerity in small cells surviving mostly on alms. Philip had a vision that he had been called to work on a high hill. He went to a mountain church, and began performing manual labor, working there as a gardener. He lived cheerfully and obscurely in a tiny cave behind the church, until people began to recognize his innate ability to settle disputes between others. They also began to notice that he had a positive effect on sinners. After Pope Nicholas III was told of Philip's abilities, he sent him on missions to help facilitate peace between warring factions. Upon the death of the Pope, it was rumored that the local cardinal had proposed Philip as successor to him. When word of this reached Philip, he ran away to the mountains to live the life he preferred one of austerity consuming only vegetation and water, When the danger of fame passed, Philip returned to his humble, austere, non-violent lifestyle and continued his teachings of brotherly love, saying, "Love one another, reverence one another, and bear with one another." *Mystics, Ascetics & Monks By: Dr. Holly Roberts*
