In light of the National Day of Truth & Reconciliation that was on September 30th, we highlight the lives of two **very heroic Indigenous Saints**:

BLESSED JOSEPH CHIWATENHWA, MARTYR



was amongst the first believers of the indigenous peoples of Canada who accepted the Catholic faith.

He helped the Jesuits translate hymns and prayers from French into Huron. He was impressed with the teachings of Saint Ignatius and the Spiritual Exercises. During his eight-day silent retreat, he composed a prayer that reveals his profound experience with Jesus: **"You love us so deeply that all I can do in return is to offer myself to you. I chose you as my elder and chief."** He sensed that he might eventually be killed for his faith and love for Jesus Christ and eventually was tomahawk martyred by two Huron.

ST. KATERI TEKAKWITHA is the first Native




American to be recognized as a saint by the Catholic Church. Kateri Tekakwitha was the first Indigenous person of North America canonized as a saint in the Roman Catholic Church. During her lifetime she came to be known as the Lily of the Mohawks in recognition of her kindness, prayer, faith, and heroic suffering.

Her name, Kateri, is the Mohawk form of Catherine, which she took from St. Catherine of Siena.
