## FAITH CORNER – THE LIVES OF THE SAINTS Saint Elizabeth was the daughter of Andrew II of Hungary. At the age of

Saint Elizabeth was the daughter of Andrew II of Hungary. At the age of four, she was betrothed to Ludwig, the eldest son of the king of Thuringia. She was sent to live with her husband's family and was treated unkindly by

some members of the Court who envied her kind and generous ways. Her marriage was solemnized when she was fourteen. When others tried to persuade Ludwig to send her back to Hungary, he said that he would rather forfeit a mountain of gold than give her up. Elizabeth's needs were simple. Her days were filled with long periods of prayer and many works of charity. When others criticized her charity, her husband said, "As for her charities, they will bring upon us divine blessings. We shall not want as long as we let her relieve the poor as she does. She spun coarse wool to be used by the poor, provided for all orphans at her own expense, was the founder of a hospital, fed nine hundred people daily at her own gate, and even brought a person inflicted with leprosy into her home. Her personal needs were few. She abstained from flesh foods at all times. Her meals generally consisted of bread and honey, or dry crust. She did not like to wear rich apparel, preferring coarse undyed cloth such as those worn by the poor people. While he was at war, Elizabeth's husband became afflicted with the plague and succumbed to an early death. Elizabeth's brother-in-law, Henry, overthrew her reign. Having been illegally deposed from her royal reign, she continued helping the poor during her few unassuming and austere remaining years. She died at the age of twenty-four due to poor health, as she had become worn down after continually sacrificing herself for the welfare of others. Legends concerning the mercy of this gentle, self-effacing and pacific young woman abound and attest to the love all felt for this woman of pure holiness and grace.
