The Totus Tuus Summer Camp is returning to St. Ambrose, from August 9-14, 2020 for youth Grades 1-12.

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


ST. AMBROSE **FORMED**

FAITH CORNER – THE LIVES OF THE SAINTS

When Saint Maurus was just a young boy of twelve, he was given to the holy patriarch, Saint Benedict, to be raised and educated. While there, he proved to be a particularly spiritual and devout youth. When Benedict was entrusted with the responsibility of directing the formation of a new colony of pious monks to live in the tradition of the cenobites, he felt Maurus was the person to head such a mission. Maurus accepted this challenge and began to form and spread the traditions of his ascetic and devout religious sect. He followed the holy rules with reverence and respect, and led his followers on paths of simplicity and austerity. He consumed only foods of vegetarian origin, predominantly bread, and dedicated himself to the devotion of God and all His creation. His religious pursuits had reached such high levels of spirituality and devotion that he thought nothing of losing his own life to save a boy who had fallen into a well. Witnesses said that when Saint Maurus saved the child, he actually walked on the water, thus permitting him to preserve the lives of both the drowning boy and himself. Although this tale may have grown from an act into a legend, its message reflects the high level of compassion and sacrifice of this devout monk. Maurus' striving to live in total austerity, to sustain his life without causing harm to any other being, and to sacrifice his own life for the life of another attests to the holy nature of this humble vegetarian saint.
