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Ideas for a Delicious Plant-Based Meal for Father's Day Weekend! **VEGAN SHEPHERDS' PIE**

Ingredients

4 medium potatoes, diced
2 Tbsp. margarine (Vegan)
1/4 cup soy milk or liquid nondairy creamer
Salt, garlic powder, and pepper, to taste
1 medium onion, finely chopped
1 Tbsp. vegetable oil
12 oz. vegan ground beef-style crumbles or cooked lentils
1 1/4 cups vegan gravy of your choice
1 6-oz. can mixed peas and carrots, drained
Paprika, for garnish (optional)

Instructions

Boil the potatoes for 20 minutes, or until tender. Drain and mash with the margarine and soy milk or nondairy creamer. Season with salt and pepper.
In a medium pan, sauté the onion in the oil until translucent.
In a medium bowl, mix the cooked onions, vegan beef crumbles or lentils, mushroom gravy, peas and carrots, and spices. Pour into a pie pan. Top the crumble mixture with the potatoes, spreading to the edges. Bake in a 350°F oven for 30 to 40 minutes, until the potatoes are browned and the crumble mixture bubbles out the edges. **Makes 6 to 9 servings**

FAITH CORNER – THE LIVES OF THE SAINTS

Saint Procopius was said to have been the first of the martyrs of Palestine. He was a man who devoted his life to prayer and holiness, and who had come to the assistance of many in need. He filled his days with meditation of the divine word. He was able to cast out evil spells by laying his hands upon people afflicted with diseases. Although he might have used these gifts for his own purposes, his only goal was to share his abilities with others. In his quest to live mercifully, he chose to live on a diet devoid of animal flesh. Although he was a small, thin man, he consumed only bread and water, and ate only every two to three days. He was a man filled with goodness and peace, yet he regarded himself as the least of men. One day, he went with some of his companions to Caesaria and had scarcely passed the city gates when he was caught by soldiers and brought in from of the governor. Although he was urged by the judge to sacrifice to pagan gods, he refused saying there is but one God, the creator and the author of all things. On July seventh, in the year 303, the authorities beheaded this humble cleric. Procopius was a man who would harm no other being, and who sacrificed his life to preserve the name of Jesus Christ.
